Testing kits

If you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of a school pupil, college student or of a staff member, you can get twice-weekly symptom-free tests.

The symptom-free tests for households are **not available from schools or colleges**. Households can use any testing offered by their employer, or **book** an appointment online at a <u>symptom-free</u> testing site, or **collect** a home-testing kit from a <u>designated</u> collection point, or if unable to travel to a site, **order** a kit online.
