# **Barnardos - Wellbeing sessions for parents**

Thank you to those who attended these sessions about anxiety and wellbeing. There were lots of useful resources and advice, a few nuggets I will share with you:

- If your children come home and say they don't remember much, give them space and encourage them to talk about other things. Ask things such as 'what made you smile today?' etc
- if your child is angry/distressed, don't talk to them at that moment, wait until they are calm
- help your child to recognise their feelings help them to find the connection between how they physically feel when they are excited/anxious/worried etc
- model our own feelings/experiences and how we dealt with certain situations
- provide opportunities for children to test and build their resilience
